

April 12, 2022

The Keya Paha County Commissioners met Tuesday, April 12<sup>th</sup>, 2022, as advertised. Chairman Ritterbush called the meeting to order at 10:05 a.m. and noted the open meetings act posted for the public. Present at the meeting Commissioners Nilson and Tuerk, Clerk Wentworth and Deputy Sheriff Linse.

After review Nilson moved to approve the minutes as presented, Ritterbush seconded. Voting: Nilson—yes, Tuerk—yes and Ritterbush—yes. All voted in favor, motion carried.

Ritterbush moved to accept the Clerk, District Court Clerk and Treasurers monthly reports and the Sheriff's quarterly report, Tuerk seconded. Voting: Tuerk—yes, Ritterbush—yes and Nilson—yes, all voted in favor. Motion carried.

Under general business Tuerk had information on 30/30 land meeting in Lincoln that he will be attending.

K. Burge -- RC&D and M Larson --Revitalization met with the Commissioners to discuss a tire amnesty for Keya Paha County. Burge will write the grant and will be back to the May 24<sup>th</sup> meeting to discuss the details of a location, tonnage and how the tires will be weighed. The grant application is due in late summer, and the county will know if they are awarded the grant in December. Tentatively, if awarded the grant, the county will hold the amnesty in March or April of 2023. With Keya Paha County as the sponsor the cost will need to be paid ahead of time and then the grant will reimburse the county, the amount will depend on the tonnage that is planned.

T. Wyrick met with the commissioners to update them on FEMA projects. Wyrick just received word that the Leavens Bridge project is approved, and the county will receive that money shortly. This will bring the total funds received to just under 1 million. The county still has 3 projects submitted to FEMA and waiting for approval that total over 1 million. The FHWA project, for just over a quarter of a million has been submitted, the county is just waiting for payment. Wyrick reported that Gary Weaver has retired, and Matt Sandoz has replaced him as the Emergency Manager for Cherry and Keya Paha Counties

The Commissioners went to lunch.

The commissioners reviewed the quote received from Kelly Stenka, CVA. Nilson moved to accept the quote for 2 fuel tanks and fencing from CVA for the amount of \$35,970.00, Tuerk seconded. Voting: Ritterbush—yes, Nilson—yes and Tuerk—yes. All voted in favor, motion carried.
